

Reading every day: the power of 1:1 reading

The expectation is that every child reads at home (or is read to by an adult) every day.

Where it is such a key life skill, we feel this sits at the very top of our home learning priorities.

Reading



Reading is one of the most valuable and precious skills that we can give a child. It will open a world of knowledge and opportunity to them and we know that children who have good reading skills do well across all areas of the curriculum. Parents and carers play a vital role in supporting children to learn to read – thank you for your time and dedication to this.

This home reading record starts with some key information about how we teach children to read and how you can support us at home. It then contains tables for you to record when your child reads and some resources that will help. Finally, it shares more information about reading including links to lessons and videos to support pronunciation.

We teach children to read or decode words using phonics and your child's school uses Unlocking Letters and Sounds as their phonics programme. This book contains some key information about Unlocking Letters and Sounds to help you understand your child's learning journey.

What is phonics?

Phonics is a way of teaching reading, writing and spelling based on hearing and identifying phonemes

- Read using their phonological knowledge
- Practise reading at least 3
 times accuracy and fluency
- QR codes to support reading at home including GPC pronunciations and actions
- Sound mats and CEWs
- Teachers will check reading records every week



Reading 'High 5'

- Bring your reading record in every day.
- An adult will check these weekly.
- Once you have read five times (this does not have to be in the same week and weekends can be included) an adult will tick the 'High 5' reading chart and you will be given a pom pom for our class jar!
- When the jar is full of pom poms, our class will get time to celebrate our success together with a reading raffle activity!

This book's stunning illustrations complements the simple story of a vain fish with no friends who finds that sharing his silver scales leads to happiness.




